Aural - Use your ear to decide if a string's pitch, or interval's beats, are appropriate.		Tools required will depend on whether you will use a mute strip or tune open unisons as you go.

	Student http://www.ebay.com/bhp/piano-tuning-wrench \$1 - \$30USD	No removable tip. Not recommended.
Tuning	Professional, with removable tip but not extendable neck. http://store.howtotunepianos.com/?product=professional-tuning-hammer \$90 - \$100USD	Tip can be changed for a better fit, or to tune pins of different sizes. Recommended for beginners.
Hammers	Professional, with extendable neck. http://www.vandaking.com/piano-tuning-hammers.html \$150USD	Removable tip. Extendable neck to change leverage and/or get into small spaces.
	Dan Levitan's C-Lever http://levitantuninglevers.com/professional.html \$300USD	Large hammer that minimizes bending of pin during turning of pin.
	Fujan Tuning Hammers http://www.fujanproducts.com/ \$325USD	Carbon fibre shaft minimizes shaft deflection during tuning.
	Impact Hammer http://www.reyburntools.com/cyberhammer.html \$500 - \$600USD	Loose head allows hammer to "knock" pin and helps to make small pin movements easier.
	Rubber Wedge Mute http://store.howtotunepianos.com/?product_cat=tools \$1-\$2USD	For muting strings.
	Felt Wedge Mute http://www.vandaking.com/s-201-mutes-temperament-strips.html \$5-\$6USD	Same as rubber mute, but felt.
Mutes	Mute Strip http://store.howtotunepianos.com/?product=felt-mute-strip \$7-\$8USD	For muting many strings at once.
	Papp's Mute http://store.howtotunepianos.com/?product=papps-treble-mutes \$10-\$11USD	For muting strings on uprights where there is no room for a strip or wedge mute.
Fork	A440 Fork http://store.howtotunepianos.com/?product=a440-tuning-fork \$15 - \$20USD	For setting the first A4 note when tuning aurally.
