

Unison Exercise

- 1. Pick an octave in the middle of the piano to work with. F3-F4 for example.
- 2. Play each note slowly and make one of the following comments:
 - a) I can hear a lot of movement in that sound.
 - b) I can hear a little movement in that sound.
 - c) I can barely hear movement in that sound.
 - d) I do not hear any movement in that sound.
- 3. Then play each note again. This time muting the right string, playing the left two strings. Then muting the left string, playing the right two strings.
- 4. Listen to the sound of each of the two pairs of strings played for each note.
- 5. Make one of the following comments on how the two pairs compare to each other, for each pair of strings created in each note.
 - a) They both sound close to the same (even if they both sound bad)
 - b) The right pair sound worse.
 - c) The left pair sound worse.
 - d) The right pair sound better.
 - e) The left pair sound better.

Make a recording of yourself playing your piano and making these comments and send me the recording to mark.
